## LETTER FROM THE MANSE

#### My dear friends

'Inspire' — 'IN' for Inverarity and 'SPIRE' for our steeple and a very warm welcome to our new friends from Inverarity Church. I ask God's blessing on this new journey we are all taking together to further God's work and mission locally, nationally and internationally. We cannot stand still in our endeavours to further God's work and to be noticed and acknowledged in our communities. The days of just coming to church on a Sunday are long gone and we the members of the new East, Old and Inverarity Parish need to work together. I foresee lots of challenges and changes ahead but I see this as a way forward and it gives me hope for the coming years ahead.

And talking of challenges and changes, this will be my last minister's letter to you in the church magazine. My last service is on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> January and to be totally honest with you I am dreading it, so it will be a lively and upbeat service. There is no way that I can get around to seeing you all personally, but I hope to see you on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> and to thank you all for the last amazing 13 years at East and Old and the last 20 months at Inverarity that I have spent with you.

Going forward, the Interim Moderator will be the Rev John Orr who is the minister at the Glens and Kirriemuir United Parish Church. John's role is to deal with the legal aspects of church business and conduct kirk session meetings. Our locum minister, the Rev Malcolm Rooney will commence his duties on 1st February and will conduct our worship services, funerals and pastoral visiting, working 2 days a week and each Sunday.

God bless you and your loved ones, God bless East, Old and Inverarity Parish and I wish you all a happy and peaceful Christmas and New Year.

We are running the "HEAT HUB" again this year to provide a place where anyone, young or old, on your own or as a group or a family can come along to East & Old church Reception Area to help save some money on heating costs at home. You don't need to be a member of the church – we welcome everyone. The Heat Hub started again on Monday 27th November and runs weekdays Monday to Friday from 9:30am to 12 noon. This will run from now through to Friday 29th March 2024.

AMILY WORKER REPORT - we've been very busy over the October Holidays, with around 200 children and their families booked onto our trips. Over the 3 days we had trips to Frosty's Soft Play, Dynamic Earth, Scottish Parliament, Ten Pin Bowling and The V & A - we received funding from Angus Council's Food and Fun Project, which is designed to help bring families together, giving them fun experiences that are often not achievable due to financial and transportation restraints. Overall, a great success.

On the 18<sup>th</sup> of October we launched our **Lego Club**, we have around 30 children signed up and are getting new enquiries every week. Forfar and Glamis Primary Schools attend and we would love to welcome children from Inverarity also. This club is held on a **Wednesday after school from 3:45pm to 5:00pm** and we could really do with some new volunteers to help out.



1 is vegetarian) and a selection of sandwiches with 3 or 4 different fillings. It's a great time and place to meet up with other people for your lunch and have a little chat.

No charge, however donations are always gratefully received.

We are a group of 10 people who volunteer every 3 or 4 weeks. Each week we have 3 on duty, 2 providing a pot of soup each and the other does sandwiches. We meet around 11:00am to set up tables and prepare, serving is at 12noon and we're usually all cleared away by 1:15/1:30pm. We always have time to sit down for a bite to eat ourselves, have a chat over lunch and refreshments. Lunch is open to all, not just church members, so please come along and bring a friend.

If you would be interested in joining our team, please speak to one of us or pop along any Wednesday lunchtime to see what's involved.





We try to make it fun, taking part in church music. Our organist Bruce and I look over the minister's choice of hymns early each week. We choose a suitable introit to sing while the Bible is brought into the sanctuary at 11:15am on a Sunday. The choir has a rehearsal every Thursday at 2:30pm. If any of the hymns are unfamiliar, we practise them to help those who are not too sure of the tune or harmony parts. We couldn't do that without Bruce's ability on the organ and his patience. Most of the time is spent on a choir anthem for the week, chosen a month ahead with Barbara Ann's approval and appropriate to the worship theme. I started logging our bank of religious songs, hymns and carols in May of 2021 and the list (still growing) now extends to around 100 pieces which we rotate over the church calendar year to avoid close repetition. Members have their favourites of course and these are fitted in when we can. We keep it light and there is often laughter during rehearsal. If you like singing, why not join us? You'll be made most welcome.


