#### A Reflection based on Ephesians 4:1-6

I therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

Paul's words — "lead a life worthy of the calling... with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love" — offer a vision of community that challenges the isolating individualism of our time. The passage affirms that unity is not rigid conformity but cooperation in diversity. The one body is made of many members, differently gifted and experienced, yet held together by love and mutual care.

This is not a call to erase difference but embrace it, weaving each strand into a fabric stronger than any thread alone. In ministry, I have seen how respecting the uniqueness of each community while working together required communication, trust and vision.

Ephesians calls us to humility, solidarity, and hope. To live "worthy of the calling" today is to build inclusive communities where difference enriches, cooperation sustains, and love remains the true measure of unity.

Book Club

'The Bookshop Ladies' by Faith Hogan - an easy read about Joy, an American in Paris, whose art-dealer husband confesses on his deathbed that he has fathered a daughter. Through a painting, Joy tracks down the woman with whom he had an affair. This woman is starting up a bookshop with her daughter in Ireland. Joy decides to stay there and help, and by working together, they make a success of the bookshop.

'Secrets of the Villa Amore' by Carol Kirkwood (BBC weather presenter) - rival Italian wine producers whose children are about to marry and bring their families together. Threatening the wedding on the Amalfi coast are long lost secrets, family drama and kidnappings. A predictable outcome but a good summer read.

The next books will be: 'Prophet Song' by Paul Lynch - a family saga of trials and traumas in a dystopian world; 'We Shall Remember' by Emma Fraser - describes the fate of many Polish people after the German army's invasion in WW11. A woman training to be a nurse who is helping

those in hiding, realises she must escape to London, where she meets a Royal Air Force pilot. It is the story of how their daughter realises her origins; 'The Outrun' by Amy Liptrot - a young woman from Orkney hits the high life of London with drugs and alcohol. To get over her addictions, she moves back home, realising why she left (family life and farming). A true story, made into a film starring Saoirse Ronan.

ROPERTY REPORT - Well that was quite a storm. Not what we expect in early August, though I do recall my father desperately trying to combine barley before a looming storm blew the heads off the grain. I hope you escaped unscathed or at least with minimum damage. The kirkyard at Inverarity is a mess, with branches scattered but thankfully nothing serious.

This year's General Assembly approved new rules for manses. This meant an extended manse schedule had to be completed prior to calling a new minister. In addition to me completing this



paperwork, the Presbytery fabric actions in order to convenor had to visit our manse and personally sign-off that it was approvements still how to the standard required for a minister today. Our manse is in system better long good condition, and the nominating installation faults.

committee could proceed with the vacancy process.

The principal access at East & Old for those with a disability is the west door with its ramped access. The area inside the doorway has been tidied up and the new wall cladding looks smart and more welcoming. This is also the main access to the stairwell up to the balcony of the sanctuary, so it would be good if groups keep it tidy.

I am getting feedback that the sound system in the sanctuary is much improved. It has been a case of slowly trying out the best settings for optimum effect. The hearing loop system is still proving a challenge and finding a solution is a work in progress. The warm summer weather meant that probably nobody noticed the main heating had to be shut down pending numerous remedial actions in order to pass the gas safety inspection. Pipework improvements still have to completed in the plant room to give the system better longevity and rectify

Investigation and preparatory work is underway at the instruction of the Kirk Session to create a working office space. The aim is to give a new administrator a good and secure business working area. Considerable admin work is required on our behalf and to assist our new minister once appointed. An efficient working environment is so important.

External maintenance has been completed at Inverarity. Where required, windows were repaired using hardwood pressure-treated with vinegar. Apparently, this significantly improves the longevity of the wood. So now you know isn't every day a school day! After the joiner completed his work, all the windows, doors and rainwater goods were painted. Not quite the "battleship grey" of the local Fothringham estate, but a muted version. Along with fresh masonry paint on the walls, it's all made a huge difference to the church's appearance .and can once again truly be known as the "White Kirkie."

June marked the start of summer and in Zuglo, there was an end
of term service for the children who attend religious classes at the local
primary schools.

The bible study groups have a summer break till September and to celebrate, they held a garden lunch/BBQ for everyone who attends classes during the year. Tamara, their new junior pastor who joined in July, will be responsible for these groups when they restart.

The main events have been the summer camps. This year, the children's summer camp started on 23 June at Kemence, a village in the mountains of northern Hungary, with 50 children and 10 adults. The congregation's camp took place at Malyi near Miskolc in July. Everyone enjoyed great presentations with lots of time to relax and get to know each other.

At the end of June, a confirmation service was held for 13/14-year-olds living in Zuglo. This year 14 young people attended, 3 of them children of parents who regularly attend church. We hope that many of these teenagers will stay with us and accept the church as a reference point they can return to if they have a spiritual desire in their lives.

They have been praying that we soon find a suitable candidate to become our new minister who will lead our worship and mission for many years.

The group have been busy during the summer with the 9:30am monthly breakfast services, mid-week reflections online along with our Locum Minister's interviews and leading worship on occasional Sundays. We intend to hold local care home services in the coming months, especially at Remembrance and Advent along with Forfar Action of Churches Together (FACT).

ngus Riding for the Disabled Association (RDA)

One of our members, Elinor Phillips, Manager and Chief Instructor of RDA was recently awarded its top volunteer honour, the President's Award. This is only awarded to a select few by The Princess Royal, president of the charity.

Elinor has spent 45 years with RDA, travelling to Ireland, Wales and



China as training instructor for competitors at the Special Olympics equestrian events. She's been surrounded by horses since she was young, and in Broughty Ferry became a volunteer and worked alongside the late Jean Thompson. In 1996, the charity moved to the purpose-built centre at South Bottymyre, Inverarity, opened by Princess Anne

Over the years, the lives of families have been transformed with the work and support that RDA has given riders. Currently 8 horses and around 25 regular riders benefit from the centre. Of special importance to us is Jeannie, who the Sunday School has sponsored since she was a foal and soon will work alongside the other horses.

The centre hosts our Sunday School picnic every year, where the children learn about the horses while enjoying their afternoon. The Sunday School holds 'Pre-Loved is Re-Loved' fundraising events that go towards Jeannie's upkeep. This is something we all feel is great for the children (and adults) who love to see how their sponsorship money is used.

The RDA is a national charity and will continue to grow.

## oyal Scottish Agricultural Benevolent Institution (RSABI) "PLOUGH ON" INITIATIVE

Rural isolation and loneliness are a growing concern in Scotland, especially within our farming community. Family farms have traditionally passed to the next generation on the death of the older farmer but as we live longer, many farms are now transferred over within the current owner's lifetime. Retired farm workers can find that busy working weeks, previously filled by an active, rewarding job, now have time on their hands and may even potentially have to move out of cottages tied to their former job. Both circumstances can have a drastic effect on emotional and physical health, bringing with it a loss of independence and support for older farmers and workers. This is where "Plough On" hopes to help.

Being a rural based Church, we chose RSABI as our May charity beneficiary and were delighted to welcome along Chris McVey, the charity's Welfare Manager. As a result, we are delighted that RSABI has chosen East, Old & Inverarity to host some Plough On meetings at Inverarity Hall. The first meeting is on Monday 6 October which will hopefully lead to further events going forward.



RSABI has already put the £231 raised by Souper Friday to good use providing practical, emotional and financial support to those working within the Scottish agriculture industry.
