Pwinning News - the Twinning committee have been active over the summer period with Zoom catchups with both our twinning partners in Zuglo church, Hungary and our friends in Zurich. Switzerland. Firstly, we met on 7th June with some members of Zuglo church for an Eco-themed Bible Study, led by Barbara Ann. We looked at texts from the book of Psalms and what they say about creation. We discussed amazing sights we've seen in the world and how God's creation leaves us in awe and some of our favourite hymns that talk of creation. The meet-up with our Swiss friends was a nostalgic reunion, re-acquainting ourselves with the Swiss and remembering our visit to them and their visit here back in 2018. We shared photos, memories and played a quiz game based on the Swiss visit to Forfar and listened to and sang some Scottish songs

including Barbara Ann's favourite - "the midgie song!"

In recent updates from Zuglo, we hear that unfortunately both the ministers at Zuglo church have been suffering ill-health of late and they ask for us to keep Noemi and Janos in our prayers. In more positive news though, the pandemic seems to now be under control in Hungary and life has almost returned to normal, with worships now taking place at full capacity, schools returned and face-coverings no longer mandatory on public transport. They also report the annual church youth camp took place a couple of weeks ago and was over-subscribed with 50 young people attending and a waiting list. The adults are now looking forward to their annual trip north for the congregational family camp next week. We pray they have a successful and enriching trip.

The Leprosy Mission Scotland is launching a new fund-raiser:

WALKING ALONGSIDE PEOPLE AFFECTED BY LEPROSY





Leprosy can cause nerve damage, leading to loss of feeling in the hands and feet. Without the sensation of any pain, cuts can go unnoticed and develop into ulcers. If left untreated and at risk of infection, the result could be deformity or even amputation.

People whose feet have been damaged or disabled by leprosy can be helped with the provision of Micro Cellular Rubber (MCR) shoes. This specialist footwear is made by Leprosy Mission skilled staff and tailored to an individual's needs. So if a patient has lost part of their foot, the sole of one of their shoes can be 'built up' to support the foot while walking. The sandals and shoes have a layer of soft rubber to cushion the foot, and a hard sole to protect it.

Shansunnar began to show signs of leprosy at a young age. However, by the time she was eventually diagnosed, she had lost all feeling in both hands and both feet. With no feeling of pain, she was unaware of a small cut in her foot, causing an ulcer to form. Shansunnar was admitted to hospital to receive ulcer care before receiving protective shoes to prevent further damage to her feet.

- Prevent new cuts, sores, and infections
