readers and especially Bruce our organist whose fingers must have been worn down to the bone with playing over 20 carols that day!



Oh Dearie me times marchin' on And Covid's still at large The nasty beasties fleein' aboot Are still oot there in charge


We practise 'oor safe distancing And wear 'oor fancy masks Oor smiles are nowhere to be seen As we get on wi' oor tasks



Can you offer some Monday's? Please speak to Barbara Ann. We had to buy play equipment suitable for this age range and we were looking for donations to off-set the costs however we have now received a £500 grant from Early Years Scotland and Learning Alliance.







On Sunday 19th December the first of our 'Sunday Night Project' – a new name for a youth club was held. Karen Liddle is running this new venture every second Sunday evening from 6:30pm and we are hoping some people from the church or community will help out on

a rota basis once again. On the 19th there was a Christmas themed evening with party food, party games, music, entertainment and gifts and 21 young folk turned up on the night and it was a hit. The next night was Sunday 9th January and more equipment needed to be sourced and bought and the youth club now has an Xbox and PS4 Pro. We are about to bring over a table-tennis table from the BB Hall but we need a new Pool Table - one that folds! Do you or someone you know, have one you don't use anymore? Could you buy one for us? On the 9th we had 17 youths which was great but sadly two of the boys caused a bit of damage to the church premises so the Kirk Session is meeting while this edition is going to print to decide what to do about it. When you run youth clubs some damage is to be expected. If we had a couple of more helpers on a rota basis this would alleviate this problem. The club meets every second Sunday evening from 6:30pm to 8:00pm.

East & Old Church working with Soroptimist International Dundee for the Worldwide Convention COP26 held in Glasgow in November 2021

The aims of the project called **Stitches 4 Survival** was to knit panels 39inches by 24inches depicting the colours of the environment including blues, greens, yellows etc. telling their 'story' knitted into the panels was a phenomenal variety of Ideas overall we produced 6 panels . Pictured below is an example of one of the designs - our other 5 were equally spectacular which we have photos of in the church. The idea of the panels were to ensure that the smallest deprived

child in the poorest countries are kept warm. Before their final destination, all the panels were shown by being hung on washing lines - fences etc. throughout the

south of Scotland before being sent to the company known as Stitches for Survival. It is gratifying to know we were part of a spectacular amount of work spreading joy and kindness throughout the world. You should have seen the famous washing greens in Glasgow Green ablaze with the colour of all the panels, before being sent to the final stitchers in the south of Scotland. The town of Portobello was where ours were finished off for transport abroad. The stitcher ladies there were so complementary of our church ladies work - well done to all involved. We made a difference to a small part of the world!
